

WORKS CITED for 5th & 6th GRADERS

The Rules

1. For each source listed, begin first the line at the margin and indent each line that follows.
2. Underline or use italics for titles of books, periodicals and software. Titles of articles are enclosed in quotation marks.
3. Note punctuation and follow exactly.
4. If required information, such as author or place of publication, is not available, just leave it out.
5. Arrange all sources in one list, alphabetically by first word, which will generally be either the author's last name or the first important word of the title

One Author Book

Author (last name, first.) **Title** City of Publication Publisher, date

Example

Walker, Niki. *Colonial Women*. New York: Crabtree Publishing Company, 2003

Two Author Book

1st Author (last name, first and) 2nd Author (first name, last) *Title.* City of Publication: Publisher, date

Example

Ride, Sally and Tam O'Shaughnessy. *Exploring Our Solar System*. New York: Crown Publishers, 2003.

Encyclopedia

Author (last name, first.) "Title" of Article.. *Title of Book* **City of Publication:** Publisher, date.

Example

Hutson, James H. "Franklin, Benjamin." *The World Book Encyclopedia*. 2006.

On-line Article from Database

Author (last name, first.) "Title." of Article. **Name of Database** Publisher of Database, date First part of web address (<http://...>)

Solnick, Bruce B. "Hudson, Henry." *Grolier Multimedia Encyclopedia*. 2006. Grolier Online. 18 June 2006 <<http://gme.grolier.com/cgi-bin/article?assetid=0142840-0>>.
